### **BRIEF HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION:**

Mr. and Mrs. Maurice Brown took possession of the new home on November 24, 1922 (Geneva Republican). The house is possibly a kit/pre-cut house. Additional residents of the house include Edgar "Ole" Hallberg, a long time city clerk, and Myrtle Hallberg nee Anderson. Edgar Hallberg lived at the house before their July 1941 wedding. They had a daughter named Mary Myrtle in 1945. The house was put up for sale in 1968 and purchased by Ronald and Linda Steele. Linda Steele was an active member of the Geneva newcomers club. They lived in the home until at least 1979.

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| The attached one-car garage was constructed by 1930; the wood-paneled overhead door was installed circa 1955-1960.   |
| The property is notable for its association with one or more significant persons—specifically the Wilson Brothers.   |
