OTHER SIGNIFICANT ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:

Porch columns with vertical molding; vertical board porch apron screen; corner windows at second floor with continuous sill/belt course; broad eave. Porch enclosed with 3/1 wood storm windows. Of particular interest is the fenestration with windows positioned nearly at the corners of the second floor.

BRIEF HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION:

The contractor was C. Alfred Anderson, a builder from St. Charles, but apparently did not have any relation to the first owner of the house.

John Alfred Anderson (1868-1946) was born in Sweden and married Freda Abrahamson (1869-1948), who was also born in Sweden. The couple married in 1893 in Kane County. They did not have children. He was employed as a molder in a Geneva foundry when this home was built.

Lawrence Abrahamson (1894-1950) took ownership of the house upon the death of his aunt, Freda Anderson. Lawrence was the son of Freda Anderson's brother, John G. Abrahamson. Lawrence and his wife, Teckla (1895-1993), and three children (Doris, Clifford, and Marvin) moved into the home in 1949.

The third owners of record were Rob & Kelly Nowak.

The property is notable for its association with architecture	e—specifically	the American	Foursquare style-	and within the
context of Swedish properties in Geneva.
