OTHER SIGNIFICANT ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:

WINDOW STYLE: Double-hung (1/1, 3/1), Slider

Front porch enclosed with aluminum storm windows. Decorative windows with elongated diamond muntins at west and north facades and west attic dormer; sleeping porch at rear with 3/1 double-hung windows. Stucco brackets support projected stair landing mass.

ADDITIONAL PROPERTY INFORMATION:

BRIEF HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION:

John Skoglund purchased the Fifth Street property in 1909 and obtained a mortgage to build the house in 1911 (begun in May 1911).

In 1892, John Skoglund (1870-1953) married Amanda Johnson (1866-1953) in Kane County; both were born in Sweden. He built this new home for his family in 1911. The Skoglund home on Fifth Street is most closely associated with Skoglund's professional activity and accomplishments in the Geneva community. (Skoglund previously lived at 315/327 Peyton Street, where he also moved to in his retirement until his death. The Peyton Street house moved in 1983 to 1N384 N. Peck Road, where it was remodeled.)

John Skoglund worked for O. A. Smith's furniture and undertaking business after he arrived in Geneva in 1886. Skoglund became a prominent businessman in Geneva, operating his own furniture and undertaking business (1900-1933). The business was passed on to his son and grandson. He was a director of the First National Bank of Geneva and involved in many local community and fraternal organizations (15 October 1953 Geneva Republican).

The Fifth Street property was sold in 1931 to Irving Miller (of the Miller family at 117 N. Fifth Street, immediately south). (Twice-A-Week Republican).

The property is notable for its association with one or more significant persons and architecture—specifically the American Foursquare style. The property is also notable within a context of Swedish properties in Geneva.
