BRIEF HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION:

In 1954, Max W. and Ethel D Dierking purchased the lot from William C. and Minnie Johnson, who owned 218 N. Fifth Street. Ethel (Johnson) Dierking may have been the niece of William C. Johnson.

In 1940, Max W. Dierking (1903-1976) married Ethel D. (Johnson) Knudert (1904-1978). They lived in West Chicago where Max operated "Max's Tavern & Filling Station" on the corner of Roosevelt Road and Joliet Road.

The Dierkings secured a mortgage and began construction of the home in 1956. They completed the house in 1957. The Dierkings lived in their home until 1972, when they retired to Homestead, Florida.

The near-original property (exterior) is notable for its association with architecture—specifically the Ranch style popularized during the mid-twentieth century (Mid-Century Modernism).
