# OTHER SIGNIFICANT ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:

WINDOW STYLE: Double-hung (1/1), Fixed (quarrel lites)

Rock-faced, stone columns at front facade lend a sense of massiveness to the small cottage; exposed modillions/corbels at northeast corner; a pair of prominent turrets rise from the primary roof plane.

#### **BRIEF HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION:**

It is unclear whether or not Benjamin W. Dodson ever intended to live in this house, however, he rented the cottage to others from the time it was built until his death in 1919. One of the first identified occupants of the cottage was the family of Charles L. Scott, a carpenter in 1920. Upon Dodson's death, the house was sold in 1920 to Clara (Atherton) Hunt (1877-1931) and her husband, Frank (1873-1959) - a prominent realtor in Geneva. Beginning about 1921, Mr. and Mrs. Hunt and 3 of their 4 children lived in the Fifth Street home. Within a few years of Clara's death, Frank Hunt sold the home and moved to Chicago. In 1941, the draft notice for Merritt A. King was sent to the address, and Wesley R King received a questionnaire in 1942.

The family of Howard Smith is listed in area phone books from at least 1956 to 1974, and Mary M Smith still lived in the house in 1991. The house was renovated from 1992 to 1994 by the Archer family.

The property is notable for its association with architecture—specifically the Queen Anne style.

#### **AS1 GENERAL DESCRIPTION:**

Per Sanborn Fire Insurance Co. maps, the wood-framed, detached garage was constructed at the northeasterly corner of the property between 1923 and 1930. The existing garage has been altered, over time, with a small addition to the rear, structural bracing, a concrete floor slab, and replacement overhead garage doors. The garage was renovated in 2019, when the two single, overhead doors were replaced with a single overhead door; the driveway was paved at that time.
