#### BRIEF HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION:

The property is the former site of the Louis Klink Livery. Later, Fritz Miller and his brothers operated a service station and garage at this location (circa 1920- 1926).

Lloyd Warber, the proprietor of the Geneva Garage, demolished the existing frame garage on First Street (March 1928) to prepare for the new brick garage (60X65) with a repair garage in the basement. The main garage and sales office were located on the ground floor, and a 7-room apartment was located on the second floor for the garage proprietor and/or manager. Warber Garage was completed in September 1928 and served as a sales office/showroom for Nash automobiles.

In the 1960s, the building housed the Geneva Republican Printing company that published the local newspaper.

The vacant building was purchased in 1986, and in 1993, it was remodeled as a commercial office for the Shodeen Group. At that time, the parapet was remodeled with the removal of the original Mansard roof with barrel tiles (likely metal tiles). (25 February 1993 Geneva Republican).

The building is representative of the early automobile service industry that developed along the route of the Lincoln Highway. Established in 1913 and completed in the mid-1920s, the Lincoln Highway was the nation's first transcontinental, paved highway, stretching from New York to San Francisco. In Geneva, the Lincoln Highway followed present-day Route 31 from Aurora and turned westward at Geneva's State Street. Consequently, many automobile-related businesses populated the corner of First and State streets in downtown Geneva; few of those automobile-related buildings remain today.

The property is notable for its association with architecture (transportation-related structures) and community development —specifically with auto-oriented businesses adjacent to or in close proximity to Lincoln Highway and Roosevelt Road.
