BRIEF HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION:

A building permit was issued for this property in March 1925, per Geneva City Council Minutes. It was reported in 1925 that "John Anderson (Geneva) and Frank Ekdahl (Chicago) are building residence just north of Louise Outhouse home." Harry Seastrom was the contractor for the \$13,000 construction. (April 1925 Geneva Republican).

Edward F Anderson received a draft questionnaire at the address in 1941. It was rezoned from R-3(multi-family) to B-1 (business) in 1982, when it was owned by Ron Johnson, as part of a project expanding the downtown area north of Hamilton Street. Scott W. Humphrey lived in the house in 1985.

The majority of the porch enclosure's windows and double front doors were replaced between 1998 and 2017.

The property may be notable for its association with one or more significant persons—namely Harry Seastrom.
