#### **BRIEF HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION:**

At the core of this frame house exists one of two homes built in 1837 by Scotto A. Clark (leader of the Unitarian pioneers from the Boston, Massachusetts area). The house was enlarged before 1869 and likely consisted of the construction of the southern upright section of the existing building.

Between 1905 and 1912, the house was enlarged significantly to the north and west; an east section of the home was removed. A south-facing bay window was also removed between 1905 and 1912. The original front porch extended the full width of the street-facing gable section of the home but was extended across the north wing between 1912 and 1923; Classical columns were likely added to the porch at that time. In 1999, the porch was reconstructed with the removal of the porch lintel/beam and replacement columns.

Much of the early pioneer development between First Street and the Fox River has been razed since the late 1970s.

The property may be notable for its association with notable persons—specifically pioneer settler Scotto A. Clark—an
community development—specifically the Early Settlement Period of Geneva (1837-1857).
