First-floor, street-facing, 2-over-2 windows appear to be original/early, others replaced after 1999. Porch enclosed before 1999; all but window closets to street at north elevation have been altered, replaced or removed.

BRIEF HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION:

The house was built by 1867 by Edward Bunker (see: 301 North First Street).

Milton and Mary Thornton moved to Geneva around 1886 and bought the house where they lived the rest of their days (25 March 1908 Geneva Republican). Milton Thornton died in 1899; the property was sold to Marie G. Hunter in 1909. The Carlson family lived in the home from at least 1941 to 1982, when Mr Leonard Carlson passed away. The home was sold in 1983 as part of the estate settlement, advertised for \$49,500. He inherited the home from his parents, John and Julia Carlson.

The property is notable for its association with one or more significant persons—specifically Edward Bunker, an early Geneva carpenter.
