

OTHER SIGNIFICANT ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:

Cut limestone sills and lintels; wood windows; front door; wood entablature; gable returns at side gables.

ADDITIONAL PROPERTY INFORMATION:

BRIEF HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION:

The limestone house was built, circa 1843-1844, by Ebenezer "Eben" Conant. Eben and his son, Augustus Conant, built a wood-framed house at the corner of First and Campbell streets (see 202 S. First Street and 18 Campbell Street) about the same time.

An 1869 map shows a two-story building connecting the two houses; the linkage serves as a woodshed on the main level and Eben Conant's "joiner's shop" on the upper level. The entrance door location can still be seen on the north wall of the stone house.

The Eben Conant House was restored in 1944 by Carl V. and Dorothea D. Krichton who sold about 1963.

Geneva History Museum Plaque - 1964

The property is notable for its association with one or more significant persons, architecture, methods of construction—specifically locally-quarried limestone construction—and for community development—specifically the Early Settlement Period of Geneva (1837-1857).
