BRIEF HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION:

The house was built in 1928 for Walter G. and Vandla L. Nurnberg; this was the first house under construction in the Riverside Subdivision (30 March 1928 Geneva Republican). Apparently, Mr. and Mrs. Nurnberg defaulted on the mortgage during the Great Depression, and title to the property reverted to the Riverside developer, Frank W. Renwick. The Nurnbergs executed a quit claim deed to Carl and Elsa Hellstrom concurrent with the transfer of title by Frank W. Renwick on 01 May 1937; the Hellstroms may have occupied the home by early 1936.

In 1937, the property was owned by Carl J. and Elsa Hellstrom, who were born in Sweden and settled in Geneva. Carl J. Hellstrom worked as an electrician for the City of Geneva Light & Water Department. In 1923, Carl Hellstrom was appointed as Assistant Superintendent of the City of Geneva Light & Water Department. In 1931, he was appointed Superintendent of the department.

In 1941, the property was sold to Sigmund and Marjorie Post. Born to Russian immigrants in Chicago, Illinois, Sigmund Slupkowski (1892-1969) and his parents legally changed the family surname to "Post" before Sigmund's marriage in 1923. Sigmund E. Post worked as an accountant for a wholesale grocer.

The property may be significant as the first house built in the Riverside Subdivision; within a context of Swedish properties in Geneva; and for its association with architecture—specifically the Tudor Revival style.
