BRIEF HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION:

James Francis and LaVerne Clinnin purchased this property from Kate (Krum) Canning in 1924 and built this Prairie/Craftsman house. The home may be a "kit house," possibly a model sold by either Aladdin Homes; Sears, Roebuck Co. (Honor Bilt Homes); or another dealer of the era.

Based on catalog home designs of the era, the original exterior may have been clapboard up to the second-floor window sills and shingle siding above. The front porch is original but enclosed. Simple brackets may have been located at the eaves but have been removed. The exterior of the house was sided with fiber cement shingles, circa 1940.

The property was sold to Frank C. and Delia Danielson in 1926 (31 December 1926 Geneva Republican) and remained in the Danielson family until 1986. Frank Danielson was a printer and Linotype operator for a newspaper, probably the Geneva Republican.

The detached garage was constructed between 1976-1977.
