BRIEF HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION:

The property was part of the Perry-Johnson property and—after 1869—a large barn was built on the lot.

In June 1966, the former Geneva Lutheran Parsonage—built in 1895—was moved from its original location at the southeast corner of Fourth and Hamilton streets. The house was purchased from William Gibbs, who intended to build a shoe store on the site (Griffin-Williams Law Firm in 2020). Robert Byers acquired the parsonage and hired Belding Movers of West Chicago, Illinois to Fifth and Ford streets. The orientation of the house on its new site remained the same as its orientation at its original site; the historic front facade faces north (the rear of the home in 2020).

Once relocated, the house was remodeled. The former front facade—with a recessed, first-floor porch below an open, second-floor porch—was remodeled. An enclosed porch was built above the former rear porch at the southeast corner of the building (evidenced by the historic eave crossing in front of a window at the second-floor porch). Later, a garage was constructed and connected to the house.
